Background

The common indicators are used to develop RDP strategies and to monitor and evaluate the effects of rural development policy. The description of the territory, SWOT analysis and needs assessment depend on availability of appropriate information, and the common indicators play a significant role in this. The impact indicators, analysed using appropriate methodology, allow assessment of the policy's contribution to the CAP and EU objectives. The initial (baseline) and final values for these indicators are one of the most important prerequisites for high quality evaluations. Full baseline information is required for the 2014-2020 RDPs.

Data for these indicators is available from official statistical sources such as Eurostat, FADN etc. at national level, but it is sometimes not available for lower territorial levels.


This represents a specific challenge for Member States with regional RDPs which have to provide indicator values at NUTS-II level.

Furthermore, enhancing the data availability at regional level is also an important concern for all Member States that aim to include regional specificities in their national RDPs.
